



## **New Sober Living Residence in Greenville, South Carolina**

With a capacity for fourteen residents, Pavillon Place is a new transitional sober living residence that serves recovering men who have completed primary treatment and who are ready to learn and apply the fundamental tools necessary to begin new lives grounded in recovery.

“These men share a desire to put their new recovery into practice in a safe, supportive environment,” said Anne Vance, CEO. “Having such an environment is so important to anyone achieving sustained recovery.”

For those patients identified as needing a sober living residence after treatment, we had been having a difficult time finding suitable living arrangements,” she said

“Our patients recognize that early recovery is fragile and that it can be a time of heightened vulnerability to relapse,” explained Susan Holman, Medical Director for Pavillon. “A prompt return back to home and family is not always feasible or conducive to ongoing sobriety and in addition, continued treatment in a less restrictive setting is sometimes warranted to maximize chances for lifelong sobriety.”

Pavillon Place provides a bridge from the learning experience associated with treatment to the application of recovery principles to daily living. With the close proximity of Pavillon Outpatient Clinic in Greenville South Carolina, Pavillon Place also offers optional and convenient access to additional treatment and aftercare.

Residents of Pavillon Place benefit from a sense of community; 12-step based fellowship and shared accountability. Stays at Pavillon Place average six months. While the majority of residents receive initial residential treatment at the main Pavillon campus in Western North Carolina, many are referred from other treatment centers from around the region.

House manager, Nathan Tate, provides day-to-day support and ensures supervision seven days a week. Residents must participate in routine house chores, agree to mandatory random drug screens and attend 12-step meetings in the community. They also must secure AA/NA sponsorship while pursuing employment, education, and/or volunteer work.

Residents are encouraged to engage in a wide variety of sober living activities, some of which include outdoor excursions, local entertainment and sporting events, golf, grilling out and gardening.
